WHY OKIZU?

While most California children suffering from cancer receive exceptional medical treatment, the therapeutic focus does not always satisfy their need to find respite from the rigors of treatment. Okizu works closely with medical treatment centers to complement their services in order to fill this need. Okizu offers these children a kindred community through which they feel accepted, experiment with new activities without fear, and have fun in a supportive environment. A week at Oncology Camp gives kids the opportunity to make friends, play games, sing songs, learn new activities, and simply be a kid. Okizu enables them to feel a sense of belonging that is often missing from their daily lives.



The medical supervision, professional support, and endorsements of the Oncology and SIBS (Special and Important Brothers and Sisters) Camps come from the children's oncology treatment centers in Northern California, such as: Lucile Packard Children's Hospital Stanford, UCSF Benioff Children's Hospitals San Francisco, and Kaiser Permanente Oakland Medical Center.
